Miami University (Ohio)





- Public University in midwestern US
- Focus on undergraduate education
- ~19,000 students on the primary campus
- ~3700 first-year students each year

What Is A Personal Librarian

- Different model for outreach
- Student is assigned a librarian before starting university
- Assist with all subjects/tasks as appropriate

Why Have Personal Librarians

- More librarian-to-student communication
- Aim to foster relationships beyond point-of-need
- Reach students who may never ask

Why Have Personal Librarians

- Proactive instead of reactive
- First year focus not always on major
 - Undecided
 - Other identities (athletes, high-achieving students)
 - General/Liberal Education

Our Personal Librarian Program

• Started in 2014

Increased scale each year since

 Now: All entering (undergraduate) students have a personal librarian

Connections

- Connections with Key Courses
 - o First Year Experience
 - o English Composition
- Identified additional populations
 - Non-native students
 - Athletes
 - High-achieving

How the Program Works

• All public-service librarians participate

- Students enter with a librarian assigned
 - Work with student affairs and admissions

- First week orientation events
- Workshops
 - Study techniques
 - Writing arguments
- Other Outreach Programming
 - Finals week breakfast
 - Meet & Greet Tours

Weekly e-mails

 Program year one: each librarian used own e-mail account

• <u>After year one</u>: utilized e-mail marketing software (Constant Contact, then Emma)

Avoiding Plagiarism in Your Writing

Citing your sources - and citing them correctly - is an important part of academic integrity in college. When you properly cite a source in your paper, you are acknowledging that person's ideas and work, instead of claiming their ideas and work are your own - that's plagiarism!

Citing is just one piece of the puzzle. Knowing how to properly incorporate the work of others into your own writing is another key to not only succeeding academically but avoiding potentially costly mistakes.

Quoting, Summarizing and Paraphrasing

What is the difference anyway? While quoting might be easy, it should only be used when the author's original words are an essential part of your argument.

You will usually write about the work of others by summarizing (condensing the whole work into a sentence or two) or paraphrasing (rewording a certain section or paragraph). This isn't always easy! This source from the Howe Center for Writing Excellence has some great tips: Plagiarism Prevention


